

MDGS Club Sales Booth Labeling Examples

- Each member is allowed to consign up to 25 lots.
- Lots can be combined within your household.
 - For example, a husband and wife who are both members and work the show can have 50 lots and label them as 1-50, rather than two sets of 25.
 - How you sell your glass determines how many lots it takes up.
 - Selling as a set or individually?
 - If individual items, do they stack?
- Each piece of glass must be correctly labeled to avoid errors in selling.
 - Each label must include the full last name of the seller and the lot number.
 - If the lot is a multi-item set, the individual pieces should be labeled “1 of 2”, “2 of 2”, etc.
 - If the lot consists of a stack of items being sold individually, each piece must be labeled “each.”

Single Item

- Counts as 1 lot
 - Vase
 - Serving Bowl
 - Pitcher

Two+ Items – Sold As a Set

- Counts as 1 lot
- Label each piece with same number
 - Creamer and sugar
 - Sugar with Lid
 - Cup, saucer, and lunch plate
 - Set of 6 Tumblers
 - Set of 4 Plates

Two+ Items – Sold Separately

- Counts as one lot if they stack; label each piece with same lot number
 - 4 plates (each) = 1 lot
 - 4 berry bowls (each) = 1 lot

Two+ Items – Sold Separately

- Counts as multiple lots if they don't stack; label each piece with a different number
 - Tumblers (6 tumblers = 6 items when sold separately)
 - 2 Cups/saucers (1 cup/saucer = 1 lot; 1 cup/saucer = another lot)
